I've pulled this stuff by the bucketful over the past month, and it just keeps coming back. Growing up, I never really knew why they called it crabgrass. Now I do, but I also think part of the reason is because we can get pretty crabby the more we have to pull it! I'm going to keep pulling it, though, no matter how much it grows, no matter how hot the days get, and no matter how hard it is on my hands. I've worked this process into a form of spiritual discipline as I consider the analogy of how we continue to grow in Christ. When Jesus shared the Parable of the Sower, sometimes we stop the idea that it's a one-time event. That seed planted either takes root right away, or it gets choked out by weeds right away, or birds eat it right away... You get the idea. What if it's more than that? What if our life in Christ is planted and rooted well, but we still face seasons where weeds attempt to choke out our ability to produce Spiritual fruit? Even though we may be well rooted and grounded in our faith, weeds can still cause damage. They may not choke out the seed entirely like they would with a young plant in the Parable

of the Sower, but weeds can still inhibit a harvest. In a garden, weeds steal nutrients, they hog moisture, some weeds invite pests that wouldn't be there otherwise, and some can even overshadow the plant so it doesn't get the sunlight it needs. Imagine this kind of damage on a Spiritual level. Pulling weeds that harm our spiritual growth is hard work, too. We can't seem to get them all on our own. When I consider the deeper matters of how I need God's grace in my life to tend this garden of my heart and remove the weeds that can harm my ability to produce Spiritual fruit, well, I don't get so crabby when I'm pulling that crabgrass after all. It's a simple application, but anything that keeps our focus on growing in Christ is worth the time and effort. So the next time you're face to face with the weeds in your garden, or in the Church yard, or the weeds in your life, pull what you can and perhaps consider this same kind of Spiritual discipline. As you consider some of these same thoughts, turn quickly to our Heavenly Father and trust that He can tend the garden of our hearts much better than we can do on our own.

Lay Visitation Ministries Updates and Information From the Desk of Tracey Burgus

Ten years ago, our churches began participating in something known at that time as the Bishop's Initiative on Poverty/Change a Child's Story. The initiative lasted two years. During the next eight years we ventured out on our own and continued giving books away. In the course of eight years we have placed over 17,450 books in the hands of young readers. A preschool aged child when this initiative began as a fifth grade student would have received over 25 books. Statistics show that more than 61% of children in poverty in America don't have access to children's books in their homes (The Campaign for Grade Level Reading.) Because they are unable to practice the skills that they have learned in their coursework at school, this puts them at a disadvantage for being able to read on grade level with their peers by the time they are in third grade (actually reading 2 to 2 ½ years below their peers.) Statistics show that children who are not reading at grade level by third grade are 13 times more likely to drop out of school (The Campaign for Grade Level Reading.) We have been able to impact these statistics in a positive way by putting books into the hands of children in our school district. We will continue to participate in giving away books to students in preschool through fifth grade during the 2025-2026 school year. Sadly, as inflation has continued to hit our nation hard, the cost of



books has increased dramatically. In the past we were able to give 4 books to each child. In the 2024-2025 school year we were able to give 3 books to preschool through third grade students and 2 books to fourth and fifth grade students (these are still awesome numbers.) Your generosity in making these past 10 years of giving books possible has been overwhelming! We have been blessed to receive grant money each year from the Burlington Kiwanis who have partnered with us to help make this giveaway happen! I pray that we again will be able to reach out with God's love to bless the children/families in our community. *Please remember to take time in the midst of these busy summer weeks to keep in contact with friends, members of our church family, and others who are homebound, in assisted living, and care centers in the area. A call or a note from you could brighten the day of someone who might be feeling isolated or depressed!
