During this time through Invitation, we also have opportunities to be a part of extending the invitation Jesus gives all people. And plans are coming together for ways we can extend Christ's love to those around us who are also witnessing the hate we've seen and heard. I would encourage each of you to find ways to either get involved in these efforts, or to be a part of shining the light in the darkness

around us. Some of the ways I've taken part in this is through Bible studies at Mediapolis RCF, through online conversations with new acquaintances, and through impromptu conversations with strangers who need someone to talk to. Let me just say, we don't truly understand the hurt people are going through until we are in conversation with them. Through the handful of times I have been able to listen and talk through some of life's struggles in this past month, I have already witnessed God working in the hearts of the hurting and making a real-time impact with healing that pain. You can witness that same kind of impact, and it doesn't have to be a Bible study. You just have to shine the light. It will happen in the ways you love like Christ, in the ways you share a listening ear or a thoughtful prayer, and by supporting others as they shine the light of Christ, too. One way to support others is through the mission trip Haley and Erika are working towards as they prepare to go to the Dominican Republic and minister to girls and young women who are trying to get beyond their own struggles of pain and self-worth. Keep a lookout for details on how you can support them through fund raising, through prayer, and through encouragement.

Just before I sat down to write these words, I found myself in a conversation with others about the power of prayer. The amount of prayer that occurs within a given body of Christ (the church) is directly related to the amount of trust that His people have in Him as their Father and Provider of all that is needed in life. A church that is healthy would and should bathe everything they do in prayer. The praying church should have people praying constantly throughout the week for every aspect of their Christian life together and their witness to the world. This praying should occur both individually and corporately. Unfortunately many people feel that they are inadequate in offering prayers for or in front of other people. Whether it stems from feelings of being selfconscious or a fear of not knowing the right words to say, or from any number of other underlying fears, the thought of praying out loud often creates anxiety in people. The good news is that God does not have a score sheet by which he measures the quality or effectiveness of our prayers. Instead of examining our use of language, God examines the sincerity and the faith within our hearts. God does not require perfection in any other part of our humanity, but honors our intentions and attempts in an

effort to grow and serve Him. Prayer is no different. As the body of Christ in the world we want to be praying people and praying churches who wield the powerful weapon of prayer with confidence in God's unfathomable power and His ability to intervene! I pray that our churches would become more and more intentional in our prayer lives both individually and together. I pray that you would join me in endeavoring to grow in this area. What powerful works of God might we witness as His people if we commit or re-commit ourselves to grow in our prayer abilities and lives? I want to take just a moment to share about the month of October and how it has been set aside during the past 31 years, as Clergy Appreciation Month. Focus on the Family named and began recognizing Clergy Appreciation Month in 1994. This was created as a formal time to honor the pastoral staff of the church however, honoring a church's pastoral staff and their families can be done at any time and should become a normal part of a church's ongoing care throughout the entire year. 
